

“Inside the Kingdom” author Robert Lacey discusses his latest book on Saudi Arabia on Nov. 5

Best-selling author follows Larry King Live, Good Morning America appearances with free public address at Lynn University

International bestselling author Robert Lacey will appear at Lynn University next week to discuss “Inside the Kingdom,” his new book detailing Saudi Arabia’s ongoing struggle between 21st Century modernity and ancient traditions, extremist elements and Western interests. The **Thursday, Nov. 5**, appearance is being sponsored by Lynn and the Boca Raton Historical Society and is free and open to the public.

Lacey, who has discussed his new book in recent days on [Good Morning America](#), CNN’s [Larry King Live](#) on CNN, and [MSNBC’s “Morning Joe”](#), will discuss his new book and what it also reveals about the Saudi’s role in and reaction to the September 11 attacks (and the “War on Terror” it inspired). His address will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the Amarnick Goldstein Concert Hall, Lynn University campus (3601 North Military Trail, Boca Raton). [Lacey](#) is the author of 20 books, including *Majesty*, the classic biography of Queen Elizabeth II. A distinguished journalist with a love of history, he wrote the series *Great Tales from English History*, and was co-author of the best-selling *Year 1000*. In 1979, he moved with his family to Saudi Arabia for eighteen months to research *The Kingdom*, his penetrating study of the country’s complex and often paradoxical culture, which was banned in Saudi Arabia – and eventually became a *New York Times* bestseller. For the past three years, Robert has been based in Jeddah and Riyadh, gathering material for his sequel -- a completely new book which relates the Saudi role in the so-called “years of terror.”

Lacey is appearing at Lynn with the assistance of Boca Raton’s Patricia and Robert Shaheen.
