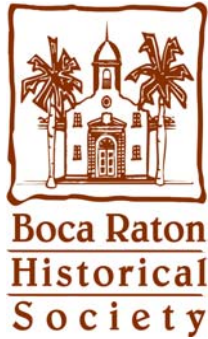

The BRHS Announces a New History of the Boca Raton Resort & Club

The Historical Society is pleased to announce the publication of a new history of our most famous hostelry, entitled *The Boca Raton Resort & Club: Mizner's Inn*. The book, the first comprehensive scholarly history of one of Boca Raton's most significant historic landmarks, is being published by the History Press and was written by well known architectural historian Donald W. Curl. Many of you know Dr. Curl from his many previous publications, such as *Mizner's Florida, Boca Raton: A Pictorial History*, his service as editor of the BRHS's Spanish River Papers, and his current capacity as hotel tour guide. Dr. Curl has drawn from many primary and secondary materials, most housed in the BRHS collection, to present a complete and accurate portrait of the hotel that literally put Boca Raton on the map. He also has tackled many of the legends and myths about the hotel. (*When was it painted pink? Were the columns in the cloister installed upside down?*) The book also includes 100 black and white images and a center insert of 20 color images of the hotel from 1926 through present day. The book retails for \$19.99 and is available through the Boca Raton Historical Society, the Resort, at major bookstores, and online through www.historypress.net.
